Mrs. Deeds--Personality, and pleasant cooperative spirit. DT


# MINSTREL SHOW



SPORTS MARION 6 VINTON 6

The Marion Indians battled Vinton to a 6-6 tie, Friday, October 12, in the Homecoming event on the Marion Field. Marion kicked off to Vinton. After holding them on our own 45 yard line we advanced on a running and passing attack to the nine yard line where McCalley passed to Horner for the score. The conversion failed.

The Bluejays scored in the second quarter after a march downfield, Kelly going around end from the four yard line. The conversion failed.

Immediately after the second half got under way Mottinger broke loose a 34 yard run, however, Marion was stopped on the 25 yard line. Vinton then took over and with the aid of some nice passes from Selken and Kelly drove to Marion's 20 yard line where they bogged down.

In the fourth quarter after Vinton had reached our 13 yard line, we started a last desperate drive which ended on the Vinton 13 yard line. One of these advances was a nice 30 yard run by Gable, who was snagged when he seemed almost away for a score.

Marion's defense was strong and McCalley and Mottinger were credited for their backfield playing.



MARION VS. MAGDOKOTA

The Maquokota Cordinals edged out a 7-0 Wamac Conference win over the Marion Indians nere Friday night. This was Marion's second loss over one win and one tie for the season with only three games remaining. It was a perfect night for football, but the Indians just couldn't get rolling.

Marion won the "toss of the coin" and received the kickoff. In the first quarter Marion had to stop two touchdown drives started by Maquokota.

In the second quarter Maquokota worked the ball up the field and caught Marion's pass defense asleep on the job for six points. Cook added the extra point on a line plunge.

The third quarter looked the best from our point of view. The Indian's line began to stop almost anything but still couldn't break through the apposition.

The final quarter was nearly the same as the first. Maquokota was penalized several times for different offenses but neither team could score.

Marion could only make four finish downs while Maquokota made 13. This week the Indians face the Manchester Manhawks, a big team with a fast backfield.
