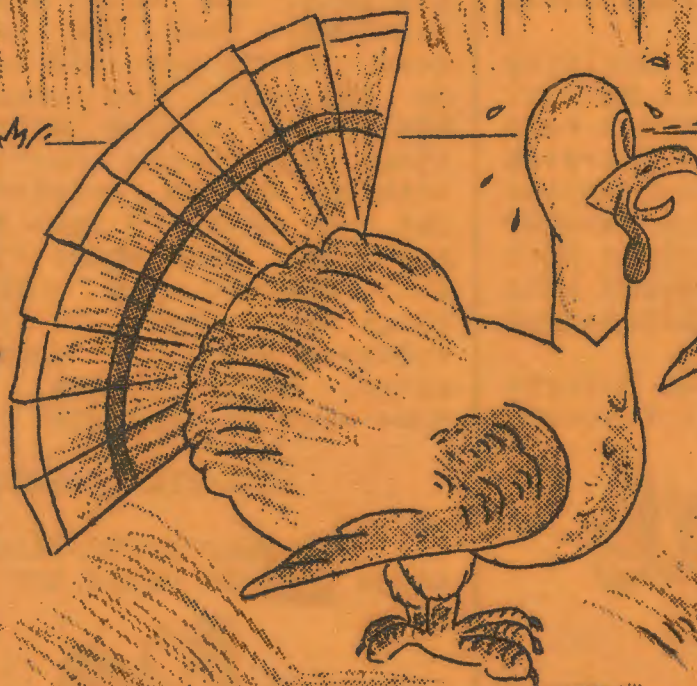
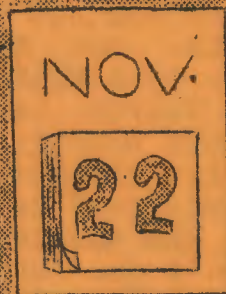

Marion's chance to gain a place in the WaMaC conference as a leading team was shattered Friday night as Manchester landed the Indians a 12-0 setback.

Tipton scored again in the second quarter on a quarterback sneak from the one foot line. The half ended 12-0.

The second half opened looking better for the visitors as Marion received the kickoff and with a series of running and pass plays drove 70 yards to score. Eastman going off tackle from the one foot line on fourth down. Conversion failed leaving the score 12-6.

But Tipton lost no time in scoring again and this shattered Marion's hopes enough that they even got a fourth touchdown before it was over. They also made the conversion on the third touchdown making the final score 25-6.
