

THE HUNT

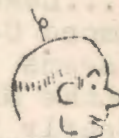



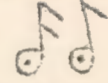

The Marion Band, under the direction of Mr. Howard Ellson, played at the Coe-Luther football game at Coe College on Saturday, October 5.

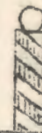
If you, or anyone you know, has a used instrument to sell, please notify Mr. Ellson. Many students are unable to begin lessons because of the shortage of instruments.

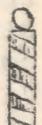
FOOTBALL SEASON TICKET SALE
