Miss Bates is the new M D E teacher here at Marion



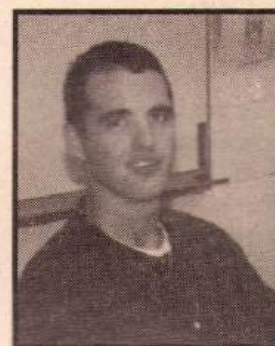

Thus far Mr. Cannon has really enjoyed his experience Student teaching hear at Marion he likes the teachers he works with and the student have been very good.

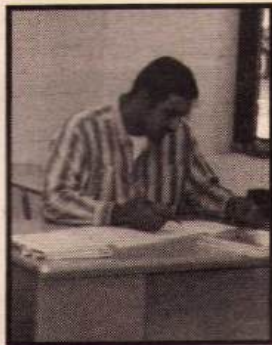
Mr. Cannon wanted to return to Marion because of the great experience he had here. He knew coming into the job that the teachers were good people and there were great facilities.

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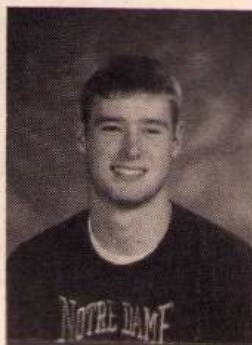

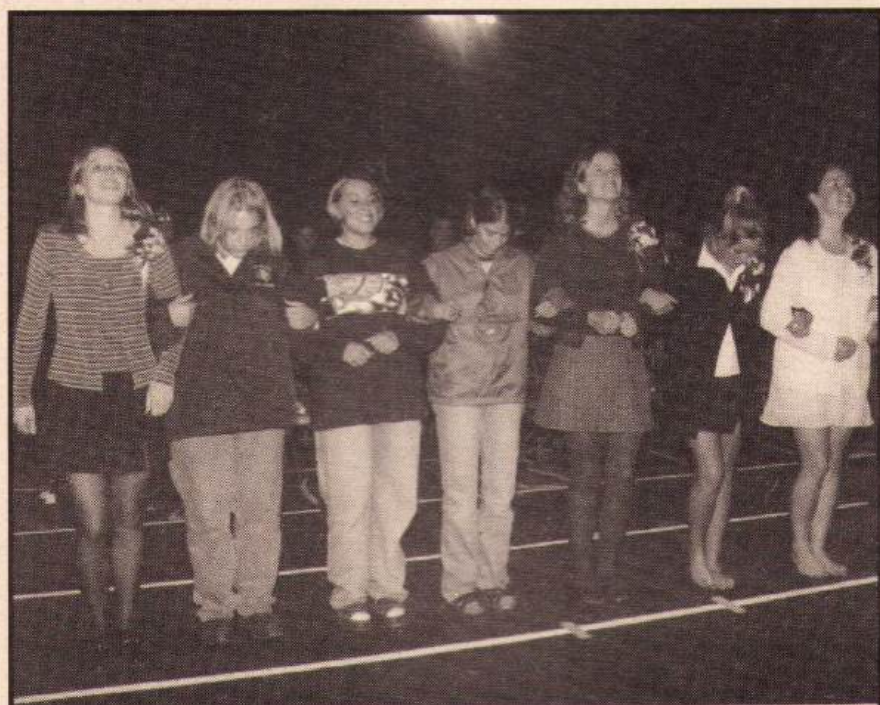

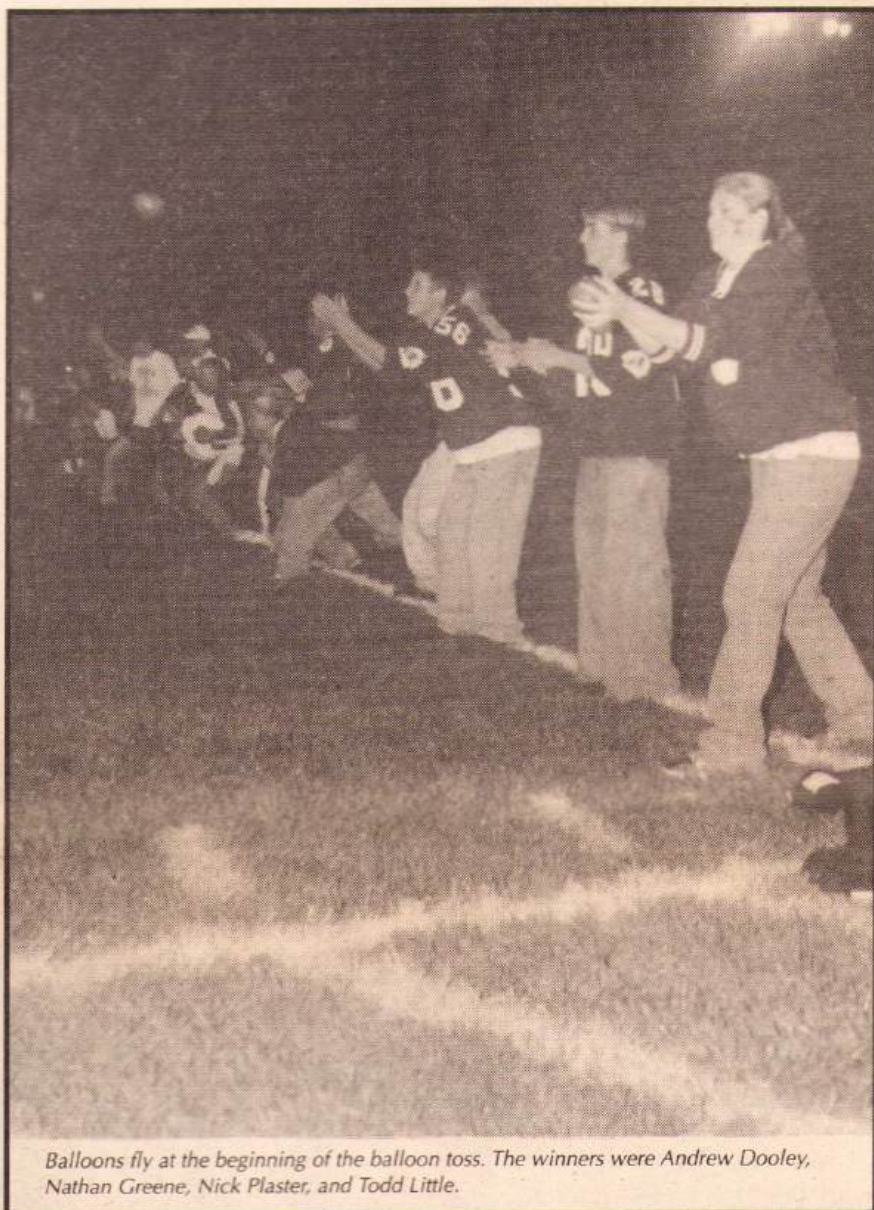

The senior girls' skit gave the fall activity members the chance to poke fun at some of the well-known MHS people and situations.

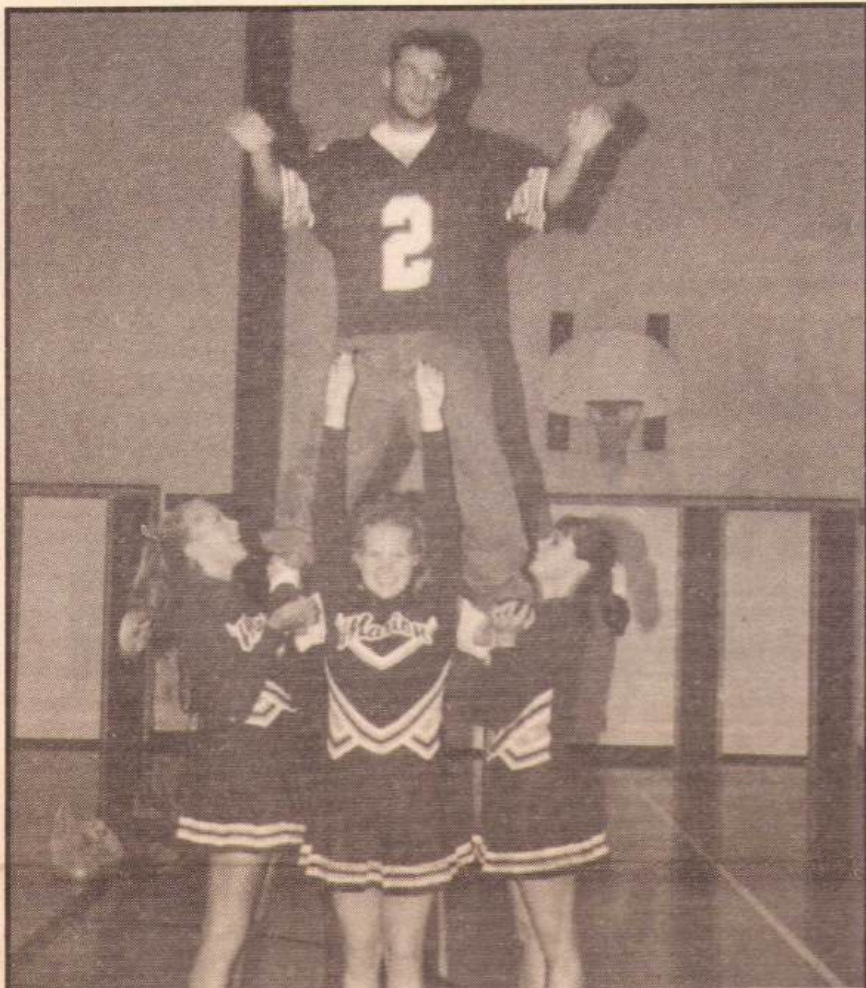


Balloons fly at the beginning of the balloon toss. The winners were Andrew Dooley, Nathan Greene, Nick Plaster, and Todd Little.

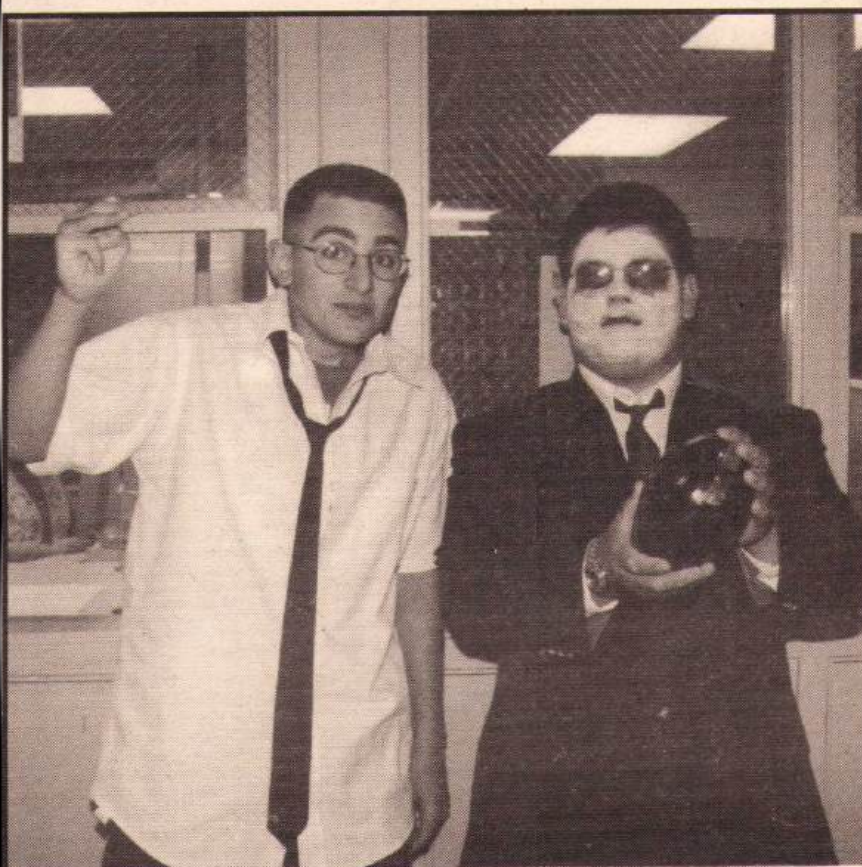

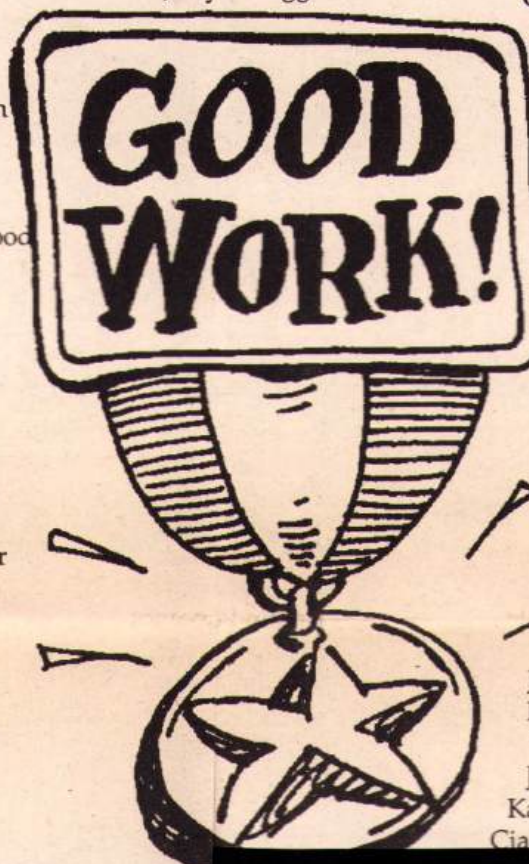
