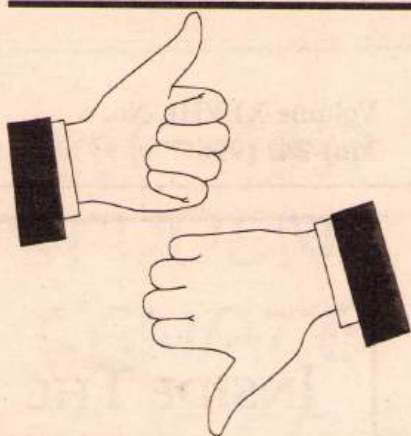

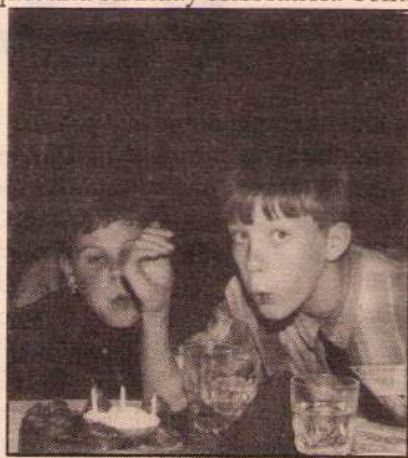
BETTER BUSINESS

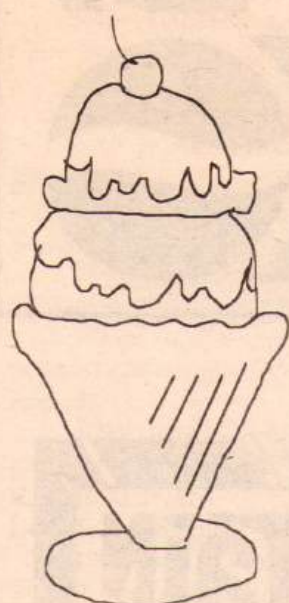
