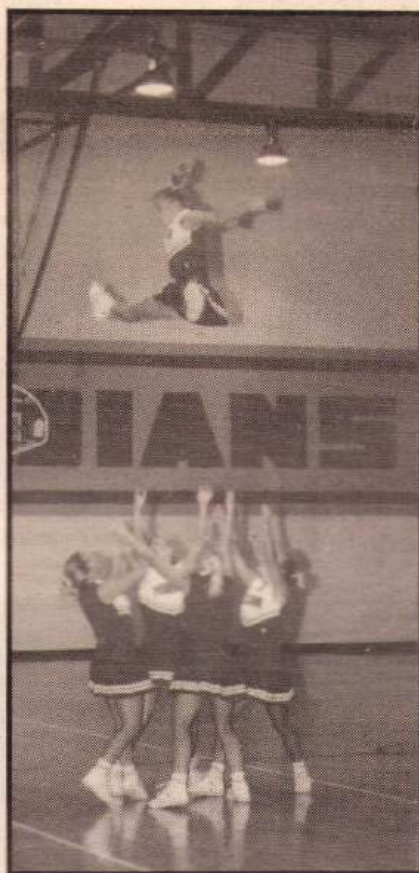

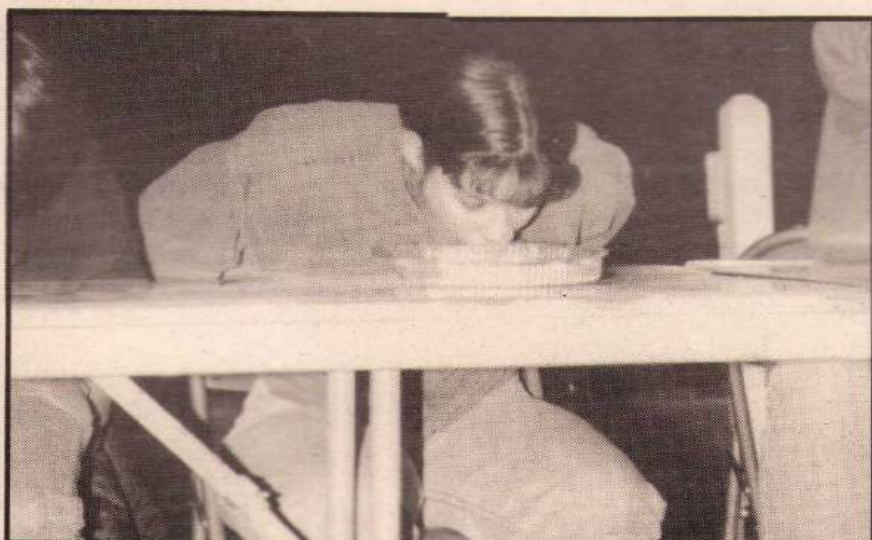

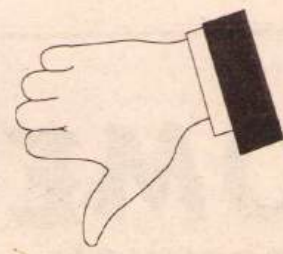

A VERY BRADY SEQUEL

Starring: Tim Matheson, Shelley Long, and Gary Cole
With a hasty plot and the same corny dialogue, "A Very Brady Sequel" left this viewer disappointed but not surprised. I didn't like this movie for the same reasons that some people will love it for. Tim Matheson plays a really dishonest guy who is trying to steal a priceless treasure that the Bradys see as just a piece of junk. Like most of us he's shocked by their honest and moral behavior. For those of you who loved the first movie I'd say go out, buy your tickets, and enjoy. But for those of you who like me couldn't stand the show much less the movie, save your money.

BULLETPROOF

Starring: Damon Wayans, Adam Sandler, and James Caan. This action-comedy about two men (one a cop, played by Wayans, and the other a small-time felon, played by Sandler) who get in over their heads. I thought the two made a great team, and their comical remarks and situations were definitely worth the money. I also thought that Adam Sandler did a great job at his first attempt at a believable character in a movie. If you're looking for a action with a comical

twist, this movie is for you.

THE ISLAND OF DR. MOREAU-

Under the direction of John Frankenheimer, The Island of Dr. Moreau is a sad example of a film that could have been excellent go terribly awry. It begins after a plane crash, where David Felis (portrayed by Edward Douglas) finds himself marooned on The Island of Dr. Moreau, ruled by an eccentric, somewhat mad scientist named Mr. Moreau (played by Marlon Brando) and his assistant Montgomery (portrayed by Val Kilmer). Mr. Moreau strives to create the perfect species by inserting human genes into animals, in the process creating a wide variety of grotesque, appalling beasts. Though the acting is laudable and the opening credits and final scene of the movie are captivating, this movie fails miserably to adapt the riveting novel by H. G. Wells. This movie crushed your heart and leaves a bitter taste in your mouth more than it entertains or excites. Without any insight to the direction or emotion of the humans, and more flaws that any one person can shake a stick at, this movie is a calamity, leaving much to be desired, including your money back. (The main fault is the inability of 19th century horror to affect the morals of 20th century.) It is my opinion that this masterpiece of a novel was better left untouched.

After tallying up the surveys the majority of workers spend their money on cars. Most of them save a portion in the bank for college or other future expenses. And many others use their extra money on clothes, entertainment, food, and other random expenses.

Most of the people surveyed

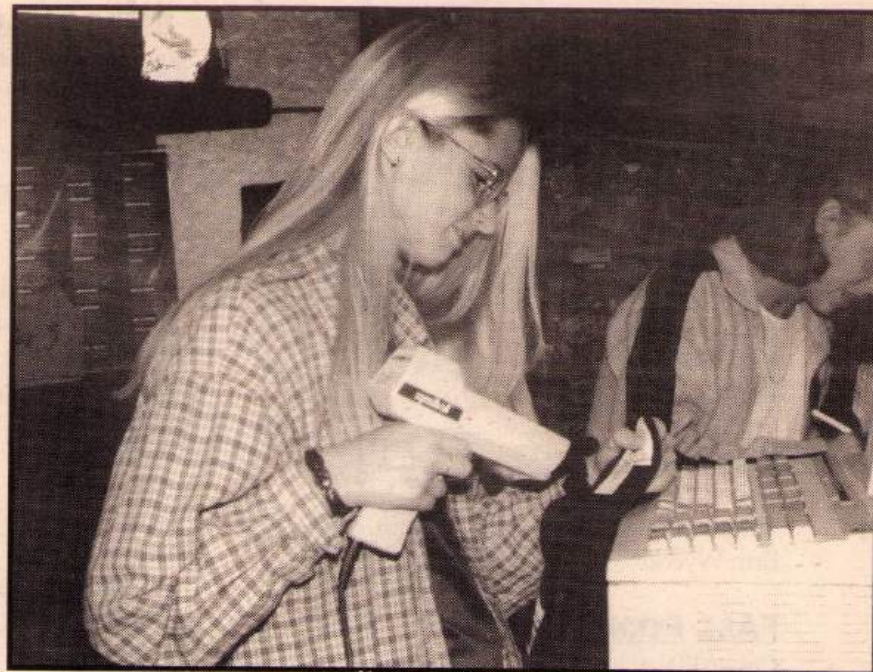

A BETTER PLACE FOR BOOKS

NEW LIBRARY A RESOURCE FOR STUDENTS AND FOR THE COMMUNITY

Recently, construction for the new Marion Library was completed, eliminating the the overcrowding at the old library. "The building of the new Marion Library is the result of hard work and dedication by the citizens of Marion and something we can all be proud of," says Jill Law, a librarian.

Located at the corner of Sixth Avenue and the corner of Tenth and Eleventh Streets, the recently opened Marion Library offers many much needed improvements. Costing an estimated 6.25 million dollars, the new library is located on one floor (instead of two) and has nearly three times as much work space. The library comes with much better lighting, comfortable seating, and has ample room for expansion.

Also, the library comes with a computer lab, which houses CD-ROM computers with programs such as Grolier Multimedia Encyclopedia, World Book Encyclopedia, OPAC (the on-line card catalog sys-

tem that includes Cedar Rapids book as well as Marion book), and the word processing program Word Perfect.

In addition, 48 parking spaces were created, a much needed change to the 5 previously available. The sound-proof booths called "study rooms" (1 available for 2 people and 5 for singles) provide a quiet place to study.

As for materials, they have been purchased, and it is now merely a process of receiving, cataloging, and putting the books on the shelf, though it is an ongoing process, and it will be no time soon before the empty space is filled.

According to the librarians, most of the feedback so far has been positive. The negative feedback has been suggestions for improvement. Although there have been some complaints about the bricks on 10th St., there are currently no plans to replace them as it would be extremely expensive.

It is taught to the students at Marion Highschool as well as students from Linn Mar, Prairie, and HLV. They are taught at the same time with the same teacher through fiberoptic technology. 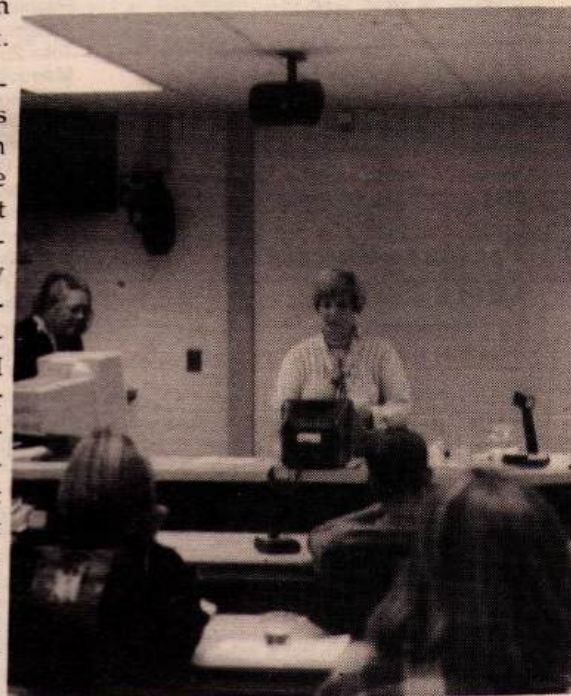

Another asset of the ICN lab is that we could get uplinks from all over the world to get in touch with famous authors, speakers, and political leaders anywhere in the world.

But the question seems to be will teachers be able to use the same method they've been using in the years to come?

"This is an entirely new room and an entirely new technique and we're still using the old techniques of teaching. We need to devise an entirely new way of teaching and I don't think that's being done right now." That seems to be Mrs. Braun's main concern about this new class right now.

I also interviewed Jason Osburn about the calculus class that is currently being taught in the lab through Mt.

Mercy. "It's taught basically like any other class but if you just want him (The Professor) to come and talk to you, you can't do that you have to actually drive all the way down to Mt. Mercy. Personally I prefer somebody being there, but I can deal with it." As far as the future in fiber optics technology is concerned Jason feels, that "the school will utilize it more, but they'll still be all like the normal classes. I think it will help give a wider variety of classes."

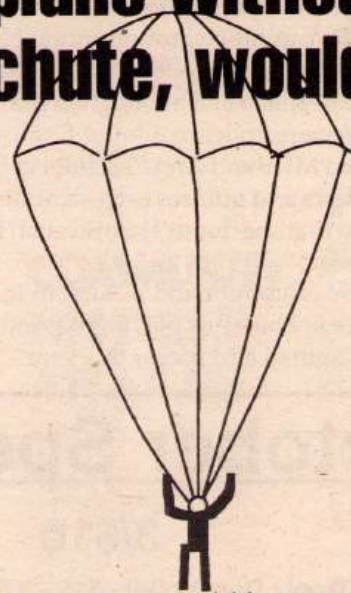

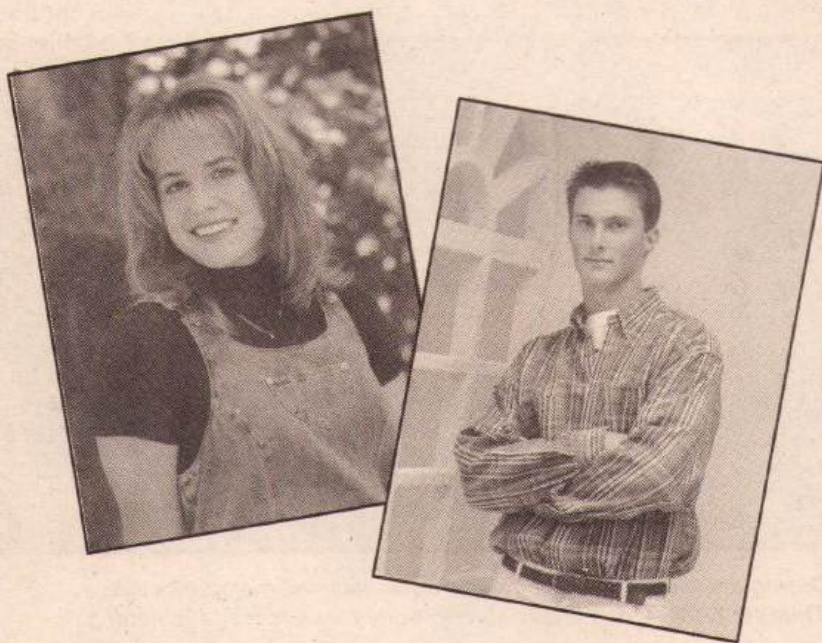

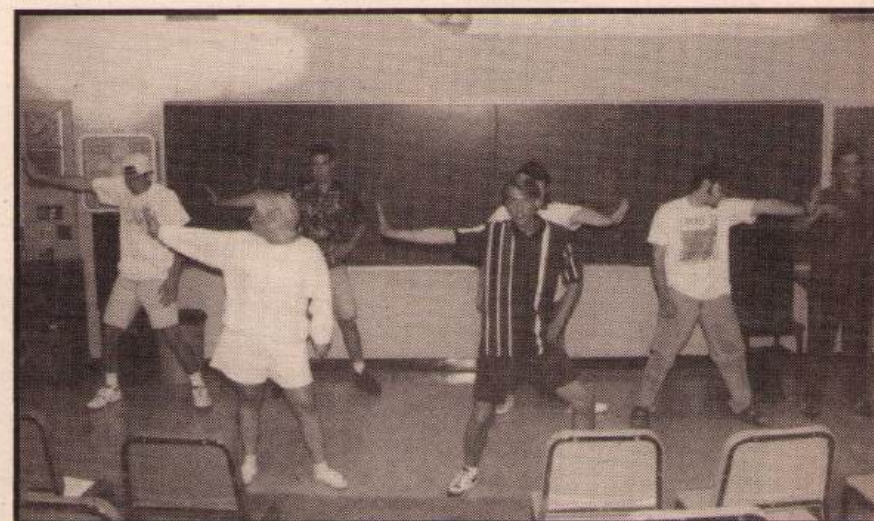
