Iowa, Iowa State, or UNI? This is a popular question being asked yet this spring among many Marion High School seniors. Although it may be a little late in the year to still be in the college elimination process, it's not too late yet. There's still time to get in those applications, though you may not get your top choices for rooming requests and assignments. Among the three state colleges, many seniors are also considering other options. These are Kirkwood and various private colleges in and around Iowa such as Luther, Loras, Central, Upper Iowa, and University of Dubuque.

There are many different ways that students go about determining their college of choice. Obviously the first choice for a lot of people would be, where are the best parties, are any of my friends going, and of course, where is the cool place to go? Using this method of determination is setting yourself up for failure. A different and more logical way of determining your college would be going over your values and ideas of what you want to achieve, such as what you want to major in and what profession or type of business you want to go into. From there you can go on to see who offers the courses you want to take. Try to tour the college and talk to someone of your same major who has been through a couple of years. "The key issues of any decision are exploration and the gathering of information. Another very important factor is to visit the colleges you're looking at," said Mr. Bailey.

The final decision to make about your college is the price. The three state schools usually range between six and twelve thousand dollars a year depending on which arrangement plans you take. If you're planning on a private college, in most cases you can about double that figure and maybe even add on a little extra.

GETTING PSYCHED UP

Have you ever been in a situation where you had to do something but just couldn't get motivated or excited about it? In the book Pitino says, "People with high self-esteem are risk takers, but more important, they are achievers."

The book also stresses a positive attitude. "Looking honestly at the reality of the situation and seeing the positive in it enhances our quality of life," says Pitino. "Self-motivated people look at each day as a new opportunity"

Coach Gaffney-Paige and Coach Laube have some ideas similar to

Pitino's on motivation.

Gaffney-Paige says, "An athlete needs to visualize themselves performing and picture themselves successful. Visualization is very important. Before competition, I would advise athletes to take a couple of deep breaths. That puts them in perspective. I really believe in a positive mental attitude."

"Each athlete may have a different routine for getting motivated for a competition," Laube says. "The ideal is to find a way to get yourself psyched up and mentally focused at the same time. Adrenaline naturally flows through an athlete directly before competition. The successful athlete is one who can channel that energy towards a productive and positive effort when it is time to perform."

Some MHS athletes have specific ways to get themselves psyched up. Track runner Kelly Weaver says, "I try to plan out what I'm going to do and just focus on the race." Angie Kneeland says, "It helps to just relax and think about achieving my goals." "Thinking positively and listening to music helps to motivate me," says Sherry Hoover.

The mental aspect of sports and life in general is very important. To be productive, we need motivation. That is up to ourselves for the most part, but we are affected by people around us, too. Success will happen if you really want it to, but you need to find your own way to prepare yourself and get psyched up about the things that may not seem so fun or easy all the time.


A Good Change

Sports at Marion are changing and the facilities are changing along with them. This summer they will be resurfacing the track, which includes the long jump and high jump areas, with a rubber coating. Resurfacing the track will mean people will be less prone to injuries (such as shin splints), and the track itself will be quick, improving race times. To go along with it, you will be able to see the exchange zones more clearly, which makes everything go smoothly. Resurfacing the track will cost approximately \$71,000. Along with this, they will be putting in a new watering system for the football field. Getting the track resurfaced may also help to hold the girls' District track meet, which will also benefit the school. "It's a definite need. You can't even see the exchange zones right now. Putting this new surface will make our times more competitive. The training will be easier on athletes and minimize injuries. Having one of the nicest facilities around will hopefully give us a chance to hold districts which will be an advantage having it on our own turf," says Coach Gaffney-Paige about the new surface.

In addition to the changes made last year, the softball field will be involved with change as well. More red crushed brick will be added, plus a new bullpen for safety reasons.

New Kind of Golf

One sport that has been growing rapidly in the last few years is disc golf (which some may know as frisbee golf). Many kids as well as adults enjoy playing this game. Some people who really like disc golf, can even join leagues or tournaments.

The object of the game is to throw your disc into the basket (which is a about a four foot tall metal basket with chains hanging from the top of it). Just like golf, you want to throw the disc the least amount of times that you can.

In disc golf there are a variety of different discs. There are drivers, mid-range drivers, putters, rollers, hooks, and slices. You can use each one of these for the different positions that you are in. Play-It-Again-Sports has the biggest variety of discs around, the price range is \$4.99-\$5.99 for used discs, and \$7.99-\$9.99 for new discs.

The closest course in this area would be the Legion Park course. This course is located behind Thomas Park. It is an 18 hole course and every hole is a par three. The course has a lot of water and trees which makes it fairly challenging. The second closest course would be the Jones Park course. High School High Tech

Marion High School is one of five area schools to offer a science and technology based employment program for students with disabilities.

Called High School High Tech, the program has been at Marion since the fall of 1997 and encourages the students to explore the fields of science, engineering, and technology. Students may be involved in activities such as corporate site visits, mentoring, job shadowing, guest speakers, summer camps, or employment. These activities can help the disabled student determine what their interests are concerning a career.

The High School High Tech program Marion is involved in is the only one in Iowa, not to mention in the Midwest. It is funded by a three year grant of \$450,000 from the department of education. There are eighteen High Tech programs in the nation.

Marion teacher Judy Weyant uses High School High Tech with her students. She helps them get involved in the many activities offered in the

program.


"I think what got me interested in High School High Tech is that it is an opportunity for special-ed kids to have an understanding of what is out there and what training is required," Weyant said. "It also helps them choose their classes in high school as to what interests them."

Sam Sparks, a junior at MHS, is currently involved with the High Tech program. He goes to Manpower for computer training. This training is tree through the program when it would have cost a good amount of money otherwise.

Terry Mcquillen, the project coordinator in the Grant Wood AEA, is very proud of the High School High Tech program. He stresses that is it a "Nationally recognized model for school-to-work."

The arrangement of this program works out very well. There are often a shortage of qualified workers for high tech industries. Students who are educated about and familiar with technology in high school could

fulfill the important need for these workers in the future. Also, disabled students could have opportunities that they never thought possible. They are often unaware of what is available to them after high school. But High School High Tech can give them valuable information about employment and career choices. They can learn many things and perfect their skills in certain areas so as to put their future in the right direction.

Mike Arbuckle, owner and founder of Arbuckle's tattoo and piercing emporium, has been in the tattooing business for 33 years and has done over 100,000 tattoos and over 5,000 piercings.

"Out of the blue, teenagers started to demand piercings that seemed like their parents would have wanted when they were younger!" said Mike.

Arbuckle's has always had the reputation of being very sanitary. For example, all the used needles are broken after a tattoo is complete, and all gauze is properly disposed of. Everything used in the process is destroyed in front of the customer.

On the other side of town is a nice little shop named "Hardcore Tattoo Emporium." The owner, Hank, has been in the business for over 12 years and has done over 20,000 tattoos and 15,000 piercings.

"You should pick a tattoo that describes who you are. Do not get one just for looks, pick one that personifies your image, and be yourself." Hank said.

Matt Post, a senior and a customer at Hardcore, said, "He broke all the needles in front of me, he used new gauze with alcohol, he changed the needles when he changed the colors, he lets the public view his work, and gave me written instructions on how to keep my tattoo clean."

Katie Sellergren at 21 years of age has become the first and only female tattooist in Cedar Rapids history. She is the owner and founder of Exodus Dermagraphics. Katie, unlike other tattoo artists, believes in quality not quantity, meaning quality tattoos at fair prices. Katie's rates start at \$50.00 an hour, making her the most reasonable artist in Cedar Rapids. Although her limited experience might make her business a little slower, her overwhelming talent for designing tattoos should be convincing enough to turn people in her direction.

The three emporiums', reputations, quality, and cleanliness, rate about the same in our opinion. Prices range differently according to the size, detail and color of the tattoo. Rates are charged by the hour, and will be quoted to you before they begin.

Construction Update

Since we have last reported on the bond issue a lot has happened. The completed design has been drawn up. Some changes were made and the addition is almost ready to be built.

When talking to Assistant Superintendent David Bradley, he said that this project still has till June before it will be completely figured out with price and the bidding that must be done to see who gets the job of building the new gym. The bidding happens when the project is over \$25,000.

The architect that did the designing was Al Varney, who works with Shive and Hatery architecture. Mr. Varney said that the complete contract amount with consultants is \$528,000. Shive and Hatery architecture will get \$455,000 of that money. That means they will be making \$65.00 an hour which is about 7,000 hours of work.

Along with all of that work, we were supposed to have a fancy rounded roof on the top of the gym, but budget wouldn't allow that. Instead we will have a roof with 1/4 to a 1/2 slope so there will be no standing water on the top of the gym. Other features are the


