Simple elimination while driving could save lives

With the enormous amount of deaths occurring in the United States in traffic accidents, why not make the roads safer by eliminating cell phone usage?

hundred people were killed in traffic-related accidents in 2008 in the United States. This breaks down to more than 100 deaths per day throughout the entire year. The risks associated with driving have always been high, but the advent of the cell phone era has added one more potentially fatal distraction to drivers, most notably the young demographic. All types of cell phone use while driving should be prohibited by Federal mandate.

According to ScienceDaily. com, a recent study conducted by Rutgers University found the use of cell phones to increase the rate of traffic deaths to both drivers and pedestrians. Prior to 2002, the study found that cell phone use actually decreased the number of traffic deaths, as cell phone owners would be able to call for help, but once the number of users surpassed the "critical mass" of 100 million this benefit was negated. "Cell phone use has a significant adverse effect

Thirty-nine-thousand-eight- on pedestrian safety," said Peter Loeb, Rutgers University Professor. "Cell phones and their usage above a critical threshold adds to motor vehicle fatalities." The specific correlations found in the studies about cell phones and motor vehicle fatalities are yet to be

> Driving on a busy interstate, looking at passing cars reveals a sickening number of individuals on their cell phones, either talking or text-messaging. This is especially true for high school and college aged people, who have an apparent need to be in constant communication. Many of these indivuiduals are ignorant to the potential ramifications that their actions may bring to themselves or another driver they come into contact with. This is caused, in large part by a false sense of invincibility, the "it could never happen to me" mindset. The sad truth is that it can.

It is adamantly recommended that drivers maintain two hands on the steering wheel so as to have

optimal control of their vehicle. This is impossible for someone texting, who must sacrifice one hand or possibly even both, the infamous "knee driver." Even hands free devices for talking on cell phones do not eliminate the problem, as the simple act of carrying on a conversation has been found do decrease reaction time. This response time is critical. tenths of seconds can literally make the difference between life and death.

Several states have already taken matters into their own hands. Five states have restrictions on hand held cell phone use, and eight have banned text messaging while driving. Others have similar restrictions relating specifically to teen drivers. Legislators in the state of Iowa have pushed for such bans, but they have not passed at this time.

The use of cell phones is an unnecessary and dangerous risk for drivers of any age to take. To outlaw their usage would be to eliminate a perilous distraction and would save lives. In the meantime, let's all put our cell phones aside until everyone reaches their destination safely.

- -The number one source of driver inattention is a wireless device
- -Drivers using cellphones are four times as likely to get into a crash of serious harm

- -10% of drivers age 16-24 are on the cell phone at any one time




Student Senate juniors shake up Shanghai Prom


The steroid scandals have been slowly eroding the integrity of Major league Baseball for the past decade or more. Dozens of players have had their reputations and career accomplishments nullified due to their association with performance enhancing drugs. Most recently Alex Rodriguez, regarded by many to eventually go down as the greatest hitter of all time, tested positive and subsequently admitted to doping. Fan outrage is at an all time high.

Lasting effects from the genocide in Cambodia

A tragedy may have happened more than twenty or more years ago, but the effect of it will last more than a lifetime. Cambodia is still feeling the effect sof the mass genocide that took place there that threw this nation into dismay.

Cambodia is a small country that is located in southeast Asia right next to Thailand, Laos, and Vietnam. It has a 275 mile coastline that borders the Gulf of Thailand. It is currently home to about fourteen million people and the government is a Constitutional monarchy. The country is still trying to rebuild itself after a large genocide happened there more than thirty years ago.

In 1975 the Communist party known as the Khmer Rouge came to power as part of the vast upheaval that was caused largely because of the Vietnam War. Pol Pot was the leader of this group and convinced a lot of people their homes were fine even though they were ruined by the war's destruction. They started supporting the Khmer Rouge when a group of guerrillas overthrew an American military government. In the four years that the Khmer Rouge were in power they attempted to make Cambodia into a new country that would strive and succeed. They forced people to move from the cities to the countryside to work and make money for them. They also murdered the educated and skilled. By doing this it caused more than one million people to die because of starvation or the innocent murders of the citizens.

Pol Pot rarely appeared in front of his people but still called the shots and ordered the killing of the innocent. From the years 1975 to 1979, an estimated 1.7 million people were killed which was approximately 21% of the population. This killing was known as one of the worst genocides in the past century. The deaths of all

these people was caused by U.S. bombs that were sent over and dropped, prisons run by Pol Pot's regime, and secret killings sent out by Pol Pot himself.

After awhile Pol Pot was overthrown by a Vietnamese invasion in 1979. The Communist party fled to the west around the Thailand border. Pol Pot went into hiding but still controlled the country and continued the killings of Cambodia's citizens.

After awhile the Vietnames faction took control of Cambodia. The leader Hun Sen, was a former Khmer Rouge and said he would not follow in his footsteps and saw the errors in the way Pol Pot ruled.

Throughout the 1980's Hun Sen continued to fight the Khmer Rogue who kept trying to take Cambodia back. Khmer formed an alliance with forces who were loyal to Cambodia's long-time ruler, Prince Sihnouk. Then in 1991, all the Cambodian factions agreed to meet with each other and work out ways for peace-keeping and elections. A treaty was made and peace was started to occur all over Cambodia.

After all this had happened the U.N. announced that there was over 350,000 refugees because of the fighting and the genocide. The U.N. spent more than three billion dollars in an attempt to put Cambodia back together.

Ever since the large genocide and fighting Cambodia hasn't returned to the nation it once was. There is still small fights that occur there because of people who refuse to follow the peace treaty. Refugees are still abundant in Cambodia and are still in search of some place to stay. The genocide known as the Cambodian Genocide has transformed a country completely. This is a good example that proves that fighting is not the only solution to problems that we face in life and that we should think of different ways to solve problems.

Battle; Seniors vs. Freshmen


The competiton of all competitions: Class of '09 vs. Class of '11


a person donates his/her hair they are really contributing to a good cause and can help many people because there are a lot of people that could really use the hair.



ACL injuries aren't a first for the Perkins'


Senior Shelby Perkins battles an ACL injury before state basketball this season.

The feeling of wanting to be done with high school is often called "seniori-


